**MISSION**

The primary goals of the CLRC are to improve the retention and graduation rates of Chicano-Latino students, to promote academic excellence, and to heighten student development. Short-term goals include outreach to faculty, staff, and students; programs to increase graduate school matriculation; collaboration with other student affairs units; and basic research on student retention and academic support services.

**DESCRIPTION**

The Chicano/Latino Resource Center (CLRC) provides a wide range of support for Chicano and Latino student organizations and for individual students on campus. Programs are designed to encourage academic excellence, community service, and personal development.

**GOALS**

- Conduct basic research on Chicano Latino Retention.
- Expand Mi Familia Retention Program to entire campus.
- Develop work space on the 3rd Floor Casa Latina at Merrill College.
- Create Faculty Mentorship Program with CLRC.

**ACTIVITY DATA**

- Served as a sponsor for Union de la Raza. Union is an informal coalition of Chicano/Latino student organizations and individuals who seek to develop better communication, networking and collaboration among Chicano/Latino students on campus.
- Provide programs such as the *Chisme* : A Newsletter Featuring Academic and Co-curricular Resources, expanded from four pages to sixteen, Chicana Latina Pipeline Project, Los Compas Men's Rap Group
- Banana Slug Fair Chicano Latino New and Parent Orientation--record number of Chicano Latino students and parents attended...welcome by Chancellor, raza staff students and faculty, tamale lunch, los mejicas performance, etc.
- Chicano Latino Transfer Student Support Group--in collaboration with the Transfer Student Center.
